

Report to the Board - November 2019

Botany 2019 Wrap up

Botany 2019 in Tucson, Arizona was a resounding success!

Approximately \$6,000 profit was made. ½ the profit retained by the conference – the other half split among the participating societies.

1200 attendees

1069 Abstracts including:

- 8 Special lectures
- 19 Symposia and Colloquia
- 545 Oral Presentations
- 340 Posters
- 1 Discussion session
- 19 Workshops

A diverse selection of field trips including an overnight fern foray. 60 Graduate and Undergraduate students took advantage of field trip reimbursements - split with ASPT. BSA paid \$1995.00 to BSA member students taking trips. I would like to repeat this program for Botany 2020. (BSA budgeted \$2000.00 – I would like to request \$2500 from BSA as field trips may be more extensive in Anchorage.)

Some comments from the survey:

- Culture of botany conference is very pleasant and inviting, contributes to enjoyable experiences speaking with a wide range of botanically inclined folks
- It was both scientifically stimulating and lots of fun
- Crop wild relative conservation field trip is very nice!
- I attended probably the best symposium since I began coming to BSA...the Land Plant Evolution symposium was outstanding.
- I really enjoy the friendly atmosphere and the chance to see cool talks and catch up with colleagues!
- This was one of the best meetings ever. The energy was great. Personally, I think it is because participants could get outside easily, and because they could hike so readily. I went out for an hour or more every morning but one. Those hikes left me high for the rest of the day.

- Loved the venue, we should consider going back there in a few years. You did a good job providing vegan food this time (usually there are no options, or the options aren't very good). The student housing rates were adequate enough to encourage students to attend.
- I think the PLANTS program and travel grants are extremely valuable. I have participated as a PLANTS mentor for 3 years, and I plan to continue participating whenever possible.

Between the comments from the survey and the financial outcome – I would say it was a successful conference!

Other highlights:

- Had another Exhibitor Raffle...Aurora Storage gave away 2 herbarium cabinets. They plan to do this again for Botany 2020 raised just under \$300.00. The "fund" has approximately \$800.00 to use to support attendance at future Botany conferences.
- Botany 2020 program committee voted to return to Tucson within 4 years and take advantage of the resorts offer to grant us the same contract.
- Kudos to Rich, Amelia and Steve BSA had a vibrant and exciting presence in the exhibit hall with a new and updated booth!
- This was the first year we offered childcare at the conference. Contracted with KiddeCorp to provide onsite services to attendees. Although very under subscribed those that took advantage of the service had very favorable comments.
 - o 8 families, 9 children of various ages.
 - o 139.25 hours of service
 - o Parents paid \$5.00/hour
 - Parents were able to contract with sitters for private after a hours sitting services...to attend banquets and etc.
 - o Total cost of program \$8578.72

Parents paid - \$696.35

BSA promised - \$3000.00

ASPT Promised - \$1500.00

Final cost to the conference - \$2686.22

Participating societies need to decide the funding model for future childcare programs at Botany conferences.
